These artists express their global solidarity to support the plight of the youth, struggling at an existential minimum, to stay afloat, in these highly politically unstable countries.

Through this initiative, we hope to support the positive growth of young lives in dire situations, as well as artists who have experienced their own struggles, during the pandemic.
